

PERRY "ALL HIGHS" TRIM BATH WRESTLING TEAM

Local Matmen Score 22 to 15 Victory in Series of Fast and Exciting Bouta Here on Friday.

The Perry "All-Highs" wrestlers took a neat 22 to 15 victory from Bath on Friday night, when the two teams met in the first of a home-and-home series. The second match will be held tonight at Bath in DeHavaland High School.

Perry was off to a flying start when Calto of Perry took a time advantage on Hamberger of Bath, with a 2 minutes, 35 second advantage in the 95 pound class.

Frederick Krupp of the "All-Highs" scored in the 110 pound class, when his time advantage proved to be 5 minutes and 30 seconds over Brown of Bath.

Carmen Ozzimo scored a neat fall in 3 minutes on Spicer of Bath, using an arm scissors and cross armlock in the 115 pound class.

In the 125 pound class, Conrad of Bath chose to rough it with Melvin Carey of Perry, but after constant warnings, the two finally went to the mat, and Carey remained on top for a minute and a half longer than Conrad.

At this stage, Perry was leading by a 14 to 0 margin, but Bath turned the tables and in quick order gained three falls for 15 points, taking the lead.

McDowell of Bath, wrestling in the 135 pound class, threw Gregorio Ozzimo in 3 minutes and 30 seconds. A half-nelson and crotch hold did the work. Ozzimo questioned the decision, but the fall counted.

Oliver of Bath and Cicero of Perry struggled for 6 minutes and 30 seconds in the 145 pound class, but Oliver finally pinned Cicero to add 5 points to his team's score.

"Jo-Jo" Ryehlik, substituting for Avery DeGolyer of Perry, found the mat coming up to meet him on several occasions, and McCullagh took a fall in 5 minutes, even. This was in the 148 pound class.

Barritt Fisher of the "All-Highs," wrestling in the 165 pound class, threw Waldo in 1 minute and 4 seconds to put Perry back in the lead, 19 to 14. This was the fastest action of the evening.

Neither team had an entry in the 175 pound class, so Joe Riccardo took on Manager Adams of Bath and received a time advantage, altho he did not throw the slippery Adams. The points in this bout were not counted in the scoring.

The final bout in the match brought Furnal of the locals and Crane of Bath together. A fall for Crane would have won the meet, for Bath, but Furnal took 3 points with a minute and a half advantage.

Two special bouts were staged, with Jones of Mechanics Institute and the Western New York 175 pound champion in the Y. M. C. A., took on old, reliable Pete Courtney. They staged a lively tussle. Jones let Pete out of several bad holds, and the match was a draw.

A fine exhibition was staged between Jones and Coach Walker of the Bath team, keeping the crowd amused as the various grapevines, hammerlocks, scissors, barlocks, headlocks and other holds were tried on each other.
