GILMAN COPS SECTIONAL TITLE

Jack Gilman is king at Dansville Central High School this week.

The strong veteran wrestler became the school's first two-time Section V champion Saturday when he captured the 145-lb. crown in "AA" competition at Corning East High.

Two other DCHS matmen, who survived the quarter-finals at Corning a week ago lost out in their bids for Sectional titles. Both Gary Kreiley, a sophomore, and Pete Vogt, a senior were eliminated in the afternoon semifinal round.

Kreiley came back at night to win the third place consolation match while Vogt again dropped a tough decision.

Gilman, who won his first Sectional championship a year ago in the "B" matches had little trouble in nailing down the title in the rugged "AA" competition.

In the semi-final battle, he decisioned Dave Ginnta of Rochester's Jefferson High by a 9-0 margin. In the finals, the DCHS matman posted an 8-2 decision over Larry DeCiantis of East Rochester.

Kreiley was a 3-2 victim of John Turner of Franklin High in the semi-final round. Turner went on to win the championship. The Dansville wrestler won 6-5

over Lee Burchim of Seneca Falls in the consolation battle-

Vogt lost 3-0 to Lou LaBoy of Rochester's East High in the afternoon round. LaBoy also went on to cop the division crown. In the battle for third place, Vogt lost 4-0 to Carl Frederickson of Newark.

The Southern Tier schools, which included the Dansville entries came away from the tournament with four titles. Finger Lakes, Rochester City and Monroe County each had three winners. A total of 47 schools had representatives when the competition opened a week ago.
