## LAKERS DETHRONED AS STATE WRESTLING CHAMPS, PLACING SECOND TO CORTLAND IN CLOSE TOURNEY

SUNYAC tournament at Plattsburgh, the Oswego Lakers were dethroned as State University Champions. The Lakers, who have won the tournament for the

Saturday, February 26 at the

past two years, placed second behind the Cortland "Red Dragons."

The three top-seeded teams fell in this order Cortland - 85. Oswego - 75, and Oneonta, 65. Brockport placed fourth with 46 points, Potsdam fifth with 36 points and Plattsburgh sixth with 16 points.

The Lakers wrestled well, placing six men in the finals. Cortland also placed six in the finals and Oneonta filled in with five men. Oswego was ahead going into the finals, but first places turned out to be the deciding factor. The Lakers didn't get the needed help from Oneonta, especially at the 115 and 137 weights was expected to win here but Cortland's building momentum turned the tables.

At 115, Oswego's Steve Mullady was eliminated in the first round by Stites of Potsdam (5-3). Prato of Cortland topped Muserallo of Oneonta for the Championship in this weight class.

At 123, Brian McGann of Oswego made a clean sweep to win the championship. In the first round he pinned French (Br.) and finally decisioned Clark (ON) (15-3) in a lopsided match to take top laurels.

At 130, Frank Frisicano (OS), last year's Champion at 123, wrestled his way to the finals but was decisioned by a strong Cortland wrestler, Butch De-Sario. De Sario incidently, has a season's record of (12-1-3) with Frisicano wrestling him to a draw during the regular season.

Kramer, of Oswego took fourth place at 137, in a strong field. Rose (Cort.) took top honors and Gomez (PL.) took second place. Dean Parshley at 145, in a nice effort took third place behind Funk (Pot.) the Champion and Kaczmarski (Br.) the second placer.

The 152 Class saw Oswego take

another third, as Baldwin defeated Aycox of Oneonta. Waitword (Br.) was Champion at this weight.

Phil Toner of Oswego took fourth at 160, also behind a strong field. The Champion at 160 was a strong and formidable wrestler, Al Sosa of Cortland.


