



Winners clash Wednesday at Trumansburg —

Victor, T-Burg dominate area mat tournaments

The Wayne-Finger Lakes-Lakes Region tournament finals, which will be held at 7 p.m., Wednesday, at Trumansburg's Building No. 1 (Junior High) gym, will mostly pit Victor against Trumansburg.

In preliminary tournaments held Saturday, Victor won 11 of the 12 final berths at Victor, while Trumansburg came up with six spots on the team decided at Trumansburg.

The winners at both places Saturday will match up Wednesday, but both groups of winners will also compete in the Section 5 finals at Caledonia, Saturday.

Actually, Victor will send only 10 of its 11 qualifiers to the match at Trumansburg, since one wrestler, 120 pounder Roy Reid, pulled a tendon in his neck and won't be able to compete Wednesday. His place will be taken by Don Neil of Marion, who lost to Reid in the finals at Victor.

The only other spot on the team from the Wayne-Finger Lakes will be filled by North Rose's Chris Gillerest, who won the heavyweight bout.

From Trumansburg, Dundee, Watkins Glen and Odessa each will send two wrestlers into action on Wednesday, while

South Seneca advanced one.

The match Wednesday will be to set up the two teams that will represent the W-FL and Lakes Region in the Section 5 finals. Winners will be placed on one team and the losers will be on the other team.

In the Section 5 finals at Caledonia, the W-FL-Lakes champions will meet the Livingston runners-up in the upper bracket where Steuben No. 1 also will meet Allegany. In the lower bracket, W-FL-Lakes runners-up will meet the Livingston winners while in the same bracket, Steuben No. 2 meets Genesee - Orleans - Monore.

At Victor, the Blue Devils sent 12 wrestlers into the finals and won in 11 bouts. North Rose's Gillerest pinned Bill Boreest in the finals to foil Victor's plans for a clean sweep.

Marion and Honeoye were shutout in champions, though Marion's Neil gets to continue because of the injury to Reid.

At Trumansburg, the event, which also served as Lakes Region conference tournament, saw Trumansburg annex both the league and tournament titles by racking up 97 points.

Dundee finished second with 81 followed by Watkins Glen with 72, South Seneca with 55

and Odessa - Montour with 51.

The league season ended in a three way tie among Trumansburg, Dundee and Watkins and it was decided that the league title would be settled in the tournament.

Top bout in the area finals should be at 145 pounds where Victor's unbeaten Penn Sheldon will tangle with Odessa - Montour's Rocky Teeter, who was voted the outstanding wrestler in the tournament at Trumansburg.

Lee drops putts in wind, rain, snow

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) — Lee Trevino dropped putts in the wind, rain, snow and also in the sunshine as he won the \$100,000 Tucson Open Golf Tournament and observed:

"Putting is like a wife. Sometimes she'll be good to you."

The 29-year-old ex-Marine from El Paso, who hit the jackpot U.S. Open with his first victory on the pro golf tour in 1968, visited the winner's circle for \$20,000 Sunday.

Sunday to capture the title, 17 under regulation figures for the 72-hole tournament.
