East Rochester captures holiday mat tournament

East High of Rochester won the 11th annual Auburn Invitational Wrestling Tournament for the second time in the past three years, edging out Mynderse Academy of Seneca Falls Saturday at ACC.

Two of the teams, Waterloo and Corning East, were unable to attend and were replaced by Port Byron. The final standings were East Rochester 92, Mynderse Academy 85, Geneva 61, Rush-Henrietta 56, Auburn 36, Central Tech 3, Port Byron 0.

The team championship was not decided until the second to last match in the 185 lb. class final, when Steve Rock of East Rochester pinned Jim Miller of Mynderse.

Trophies were awarded to John Szkolnik of Geneva (107 lbs.) and Stuart Smith of Mynderse Academy (165 lbs.) for outstanding wrestler of the tournament and fastest pins, respectively.

East Rochester and Mynderse dominated the tournament for the most part, placing a total of 13 out of 24 men in the finals. The final standings showed East Rochester, Mynderse and Geneva, each having three class championships. Auburn two and Rush Henrietta 1.

Summary of Final Matches:

98 lb. — Tim Welsh of Geneva defeated Joe Lorenzetti of Mynderse by a score of 6-0. Welsh dominated the match by scoring points on a takedown, reversal, and 2 points for riding time.

107 lb. — John Szkolnik of Geneva, the outstanding wrestler, defeated Al Solomon (R.H.) 5-2 in overtime. This was a very even match, as the score was tied 2-2 at the end of regulation time but in the two overtime periods Szkolnik scored a reversal and a point for riding time to become the 107-lb. champ.

115 lb. — Mike Calabro de-

feated Bryon O'lena of E.R. 9-2. Previous to this O'lena had been undefeated. He is only a sophomore.

123 lb. — D. Ranieri of Rush Henrietta pinned Cotronco of East Rochester in 5:49. Ranieri was ahead 3-0 before the pin occurred.

130 lb. Rick DiFabio of Auburn defeated Larry Achenbeau in overtime 4-1. In regulation time the score was tied 1-1 as each grappler scored an escape. DiFabio won in the first overtime period scoring an escape and a takedown.

137 lb. — Dave Atkinson of Geneva defeated Mike Bullis of Mynderse 9-3. Atkinson had an easy time as he jumped ahead 9-1 and Bullis was never able to catch up.

145 lb. — Greg Amidon of Mynderse defeated Pete Duffy by a score of 5-4. Amidon scored his winning point as Duffy was called for stalling toward the end of the second period.

155 lb. — Dick O'lena of E. R. defeated Doug Chapin of Auburn by a score of 2-1. Chapin scored an escape in the third period to pull within one point of O'lena but was unable to score any further points.

165 lb. — Stu Smith of Mynderse defeated Ken Wintercorn by a score 5-0. Smith pinned his two previous opponents and had an easy time with Wintercorn.

175 lb. — Rick Cenzi of Rush Henrietta was pinned by Tim Gay of East Rochester in 4:37. This gave E.R. a 88-85 lead over Mynderse.

185 lb. — Steve Rock of East R. pinned Frank Miller of Mynderse in 2:23. This match gave East Rochester the championship.

HVTWT—Willie Humphrey of Auburn defeated Joe Wells of Rush Henrietta by a score of 8-1. Humphrey controlled his match as he rolled on to his 5th win in a

row this season.

The Auburn wrestlers did not show their full potential as a team. Coach Dick Jones said he was disappointed and he thought some of the boys could have done much better.
