# Mat duels Saturday at ACC

The Auburn High grapplers, coached by Dick Jones, host the 11th Annual Auburn Invitational Wrestling Tournament, at ACC gym on Saturday.

A field of 8 teams will participate including last year's winner Mynderse Academy, Waterloo, Geneva, East High School of Rochester, Rush Henrietta, Corning East, Central Tech, and Auburn.

This article features four of the eight teams entered.

**Mynderse** — This school has two of last year's champs returning. Alan Calabro, 115 lbs., has compiled a 45-8-1 record during his three years of varsity competition.

He has twice been Wayne Finger Lakes champion. Dave Moreland, 175 lbs., has recorded a 35-5 record along with one league championship.

Mynderse was co-champ of The Finger Lakes last year and has a good chance of winning the Christmas Tournament this year. For the past two years they have also won the Caladonia Tournament.

**Rush Henrietta** — Another contender for the Tournament crown this year is Rush Henrietta.

They have a 2-0 record and place third in the Caladonia Tournament, which included four first place finishers and four third place.

In the 123 lb. class, Dan Ranieri won the Caladonia Tournament. Returning are last year's third place finishers Tom Korn, 145 lbs., and Jerry Wells, 185 lbs. Al Solomon, who has compiled a 20-2-2 record, and has also finished first and third in the 107 lb. class in the '67 and '68 Auburn Tournament.

**Waterloo** — This is the first year for Waterloo in the tourna-

ment. They have 11 lettermen returning from last year's team which had an overall record of 6-7. The strong classes for Waterloo are 98 lbs. and 175 lbs. Their record this season is 4-1.

**Auburn** — From last year's squad, a total of 10 lettermen have returned. Dave Morehiser and Bill Bellinger, the only newcomers to the squad have recorded 3-0 records so far this season.

Auburn has a 3-0 record this year, limiting their opponents to a total of 14 points, while scoring 134 themselves.

Co-captains Doug Chapin (155 lbs.) and Rick DiFabio (120 lbs.), with Fred Hernans all finished 2nd in last year's tournament.

Last year's fifth place finish for Auburn should be improved as they could be a powerful contender for this year's title.

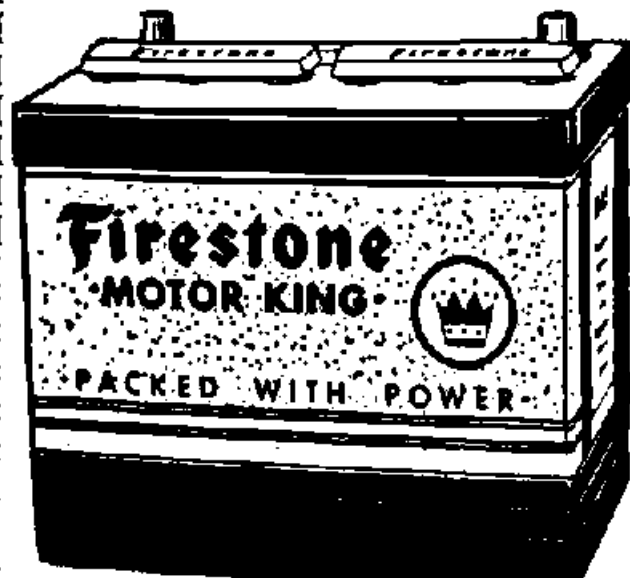
