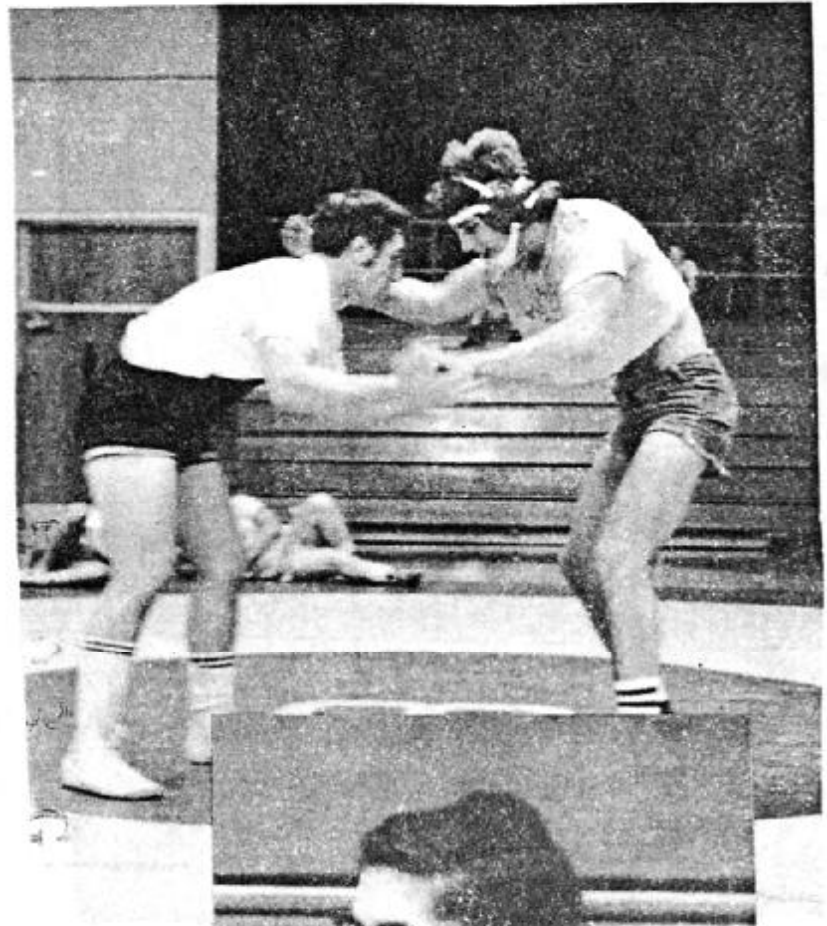

IRONDEQUOIT HIGH'S TIM BORSHOFF SURPRISED DEFENDING CHAMPION BILLY WELSH OF GENEVA AND DETHRONED HIM FOR THE CLASS A TITLE IN 119 LB. ACTION OF THE 1971-72 SECTION V TOURNAMENT. 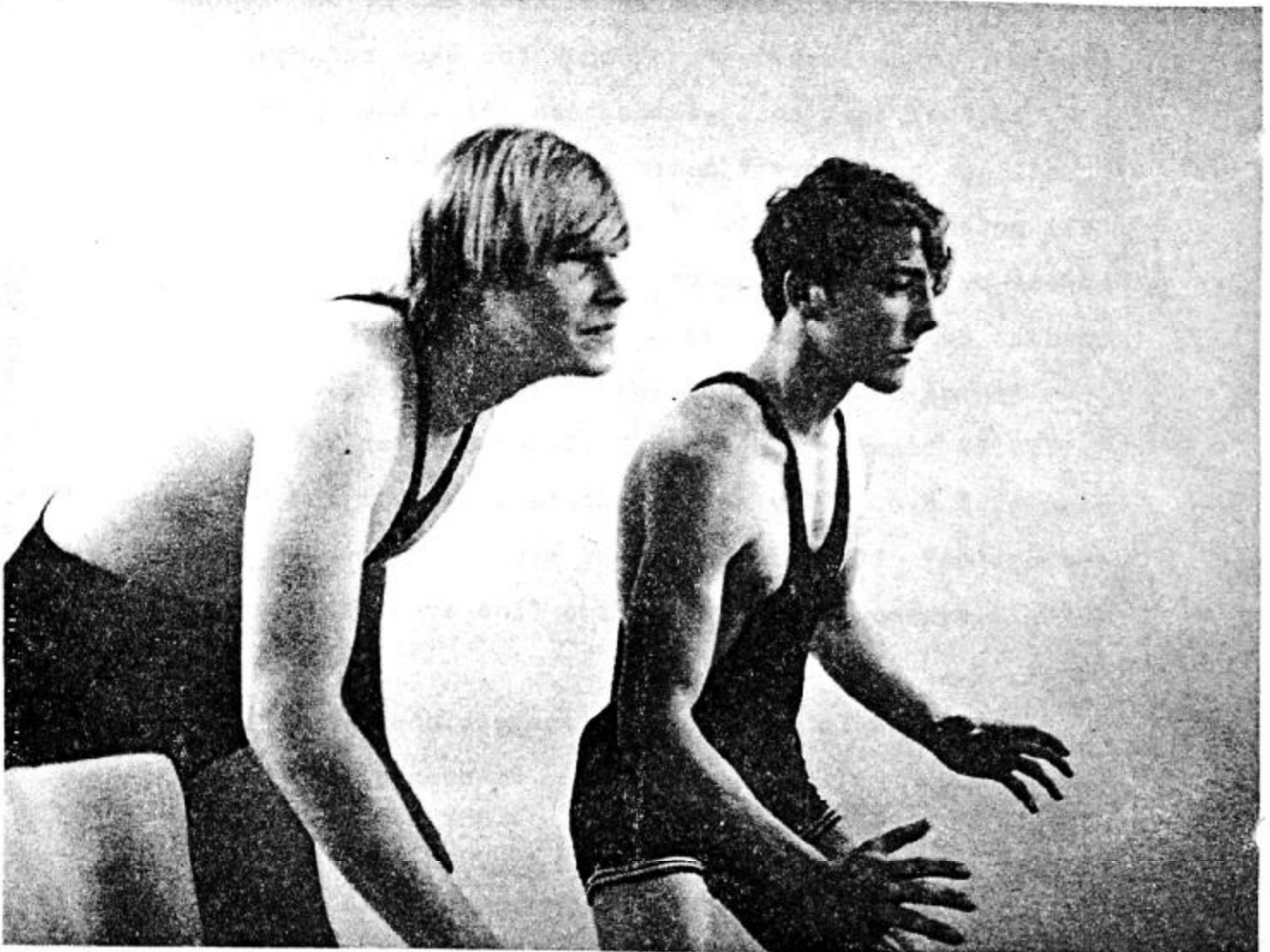

The grappler pictured at the left is former Brockport Central star Jerry DeHey, now a sophomore at Fisher. His major is Physics.

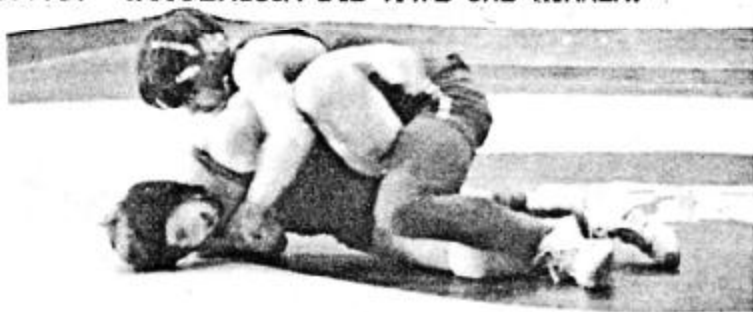
## A SPECIAL SECTION: OFF SEASON 1972

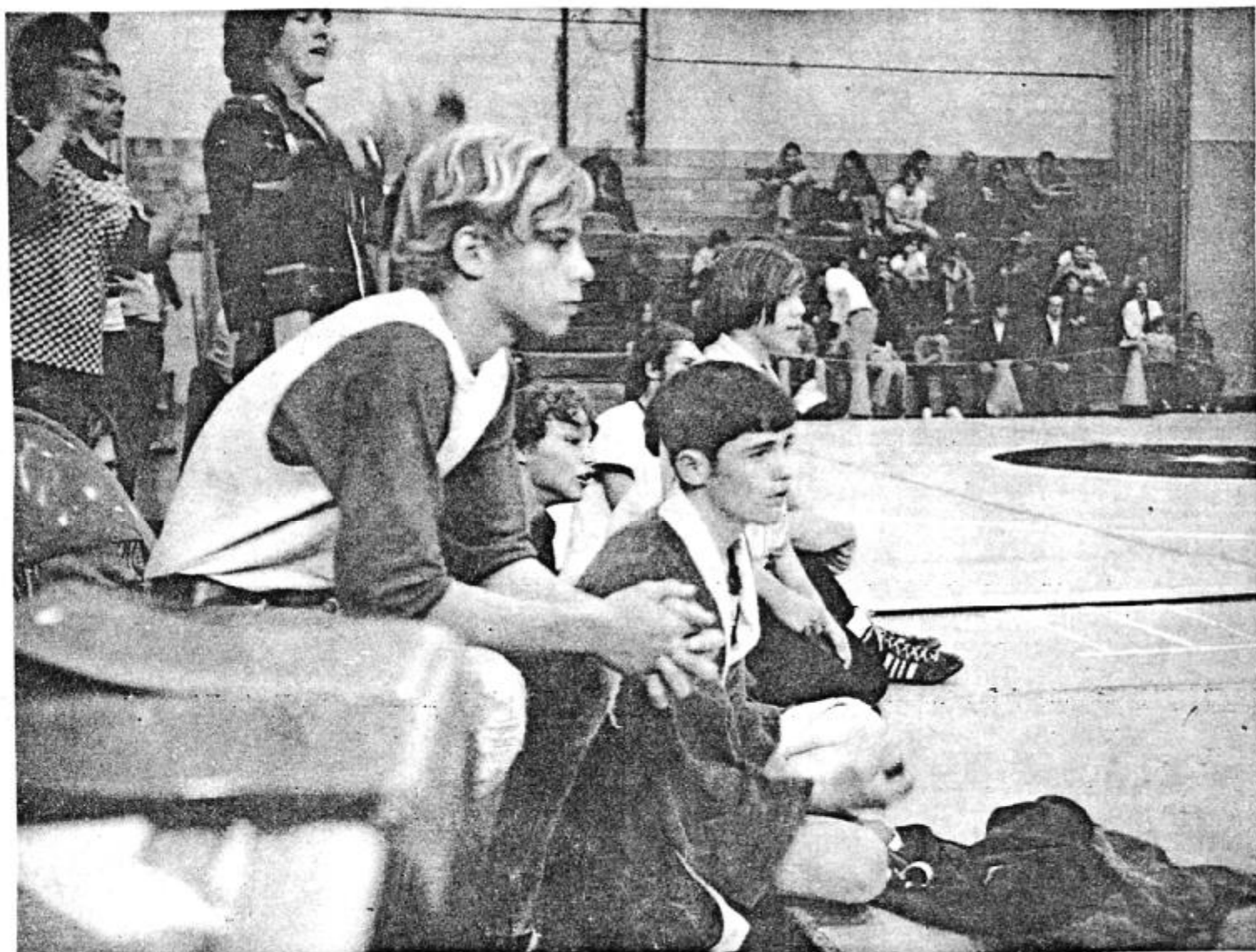

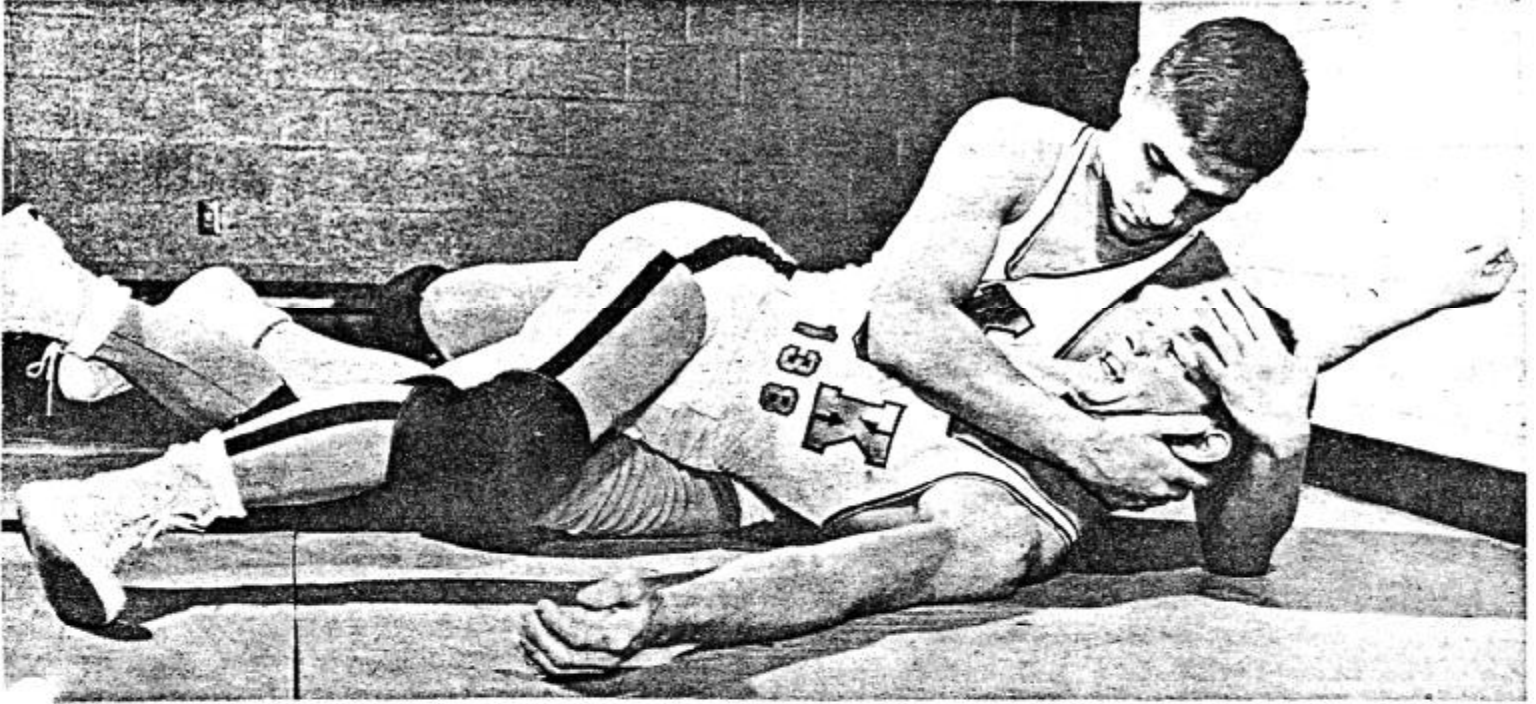

HIGH SCHOOL ALL-AMERICA - some of Rochester's first  
\*\*\*\*\*

In 1965, two seniors - RON RAUSCHER of Eastridge and TOM BORSHOFF of Irondequoit - were named to the high school All-America team. The two, who had faced each other several times on the local mats, were



the first Rochester area selections to the national High School All-America wrestling team.

In 1966, three local grapplers were named to the All-America team and another merited honorable mention. The three All-Americans were Bishop Kearney's Tom Bailey and Dan Oberst, pictured above, and Eastridge's Bruce Martin, shown in the photo below.



One of Martin's teammates, Lloyd Swart, was the honorable mention. All four 1966 honorees were seniors. Since that time, Rochester has had a number of additional All-America selections but none were any greater than these.

The local school that has had the most All-Americans over the years is Irondequoit.
