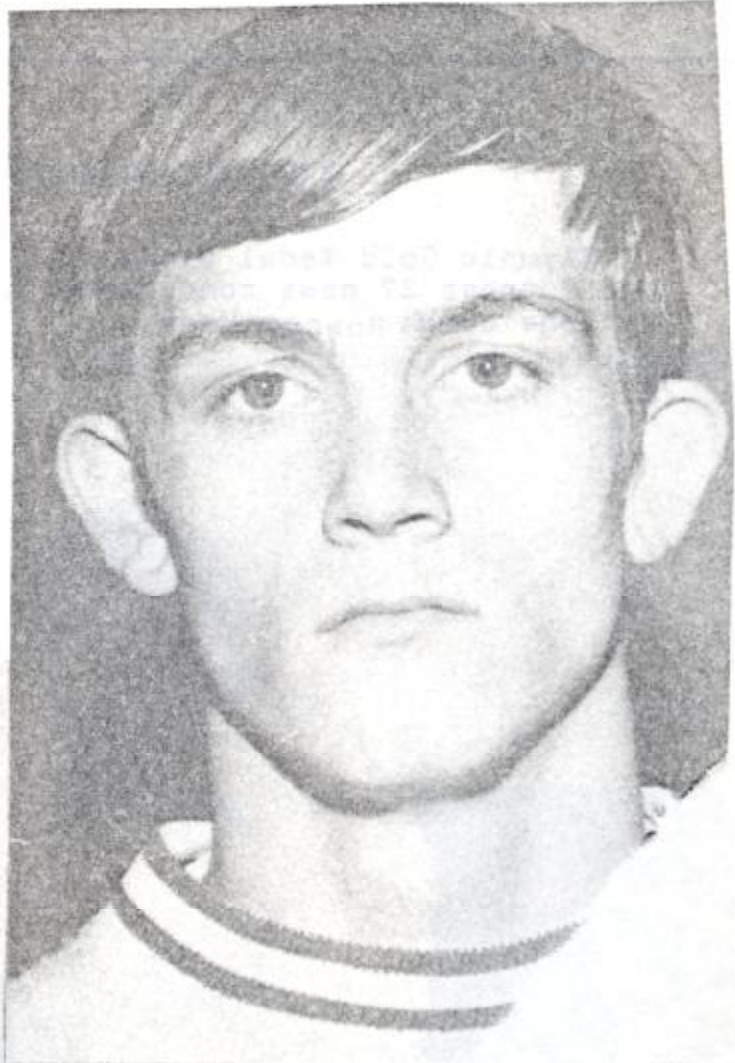

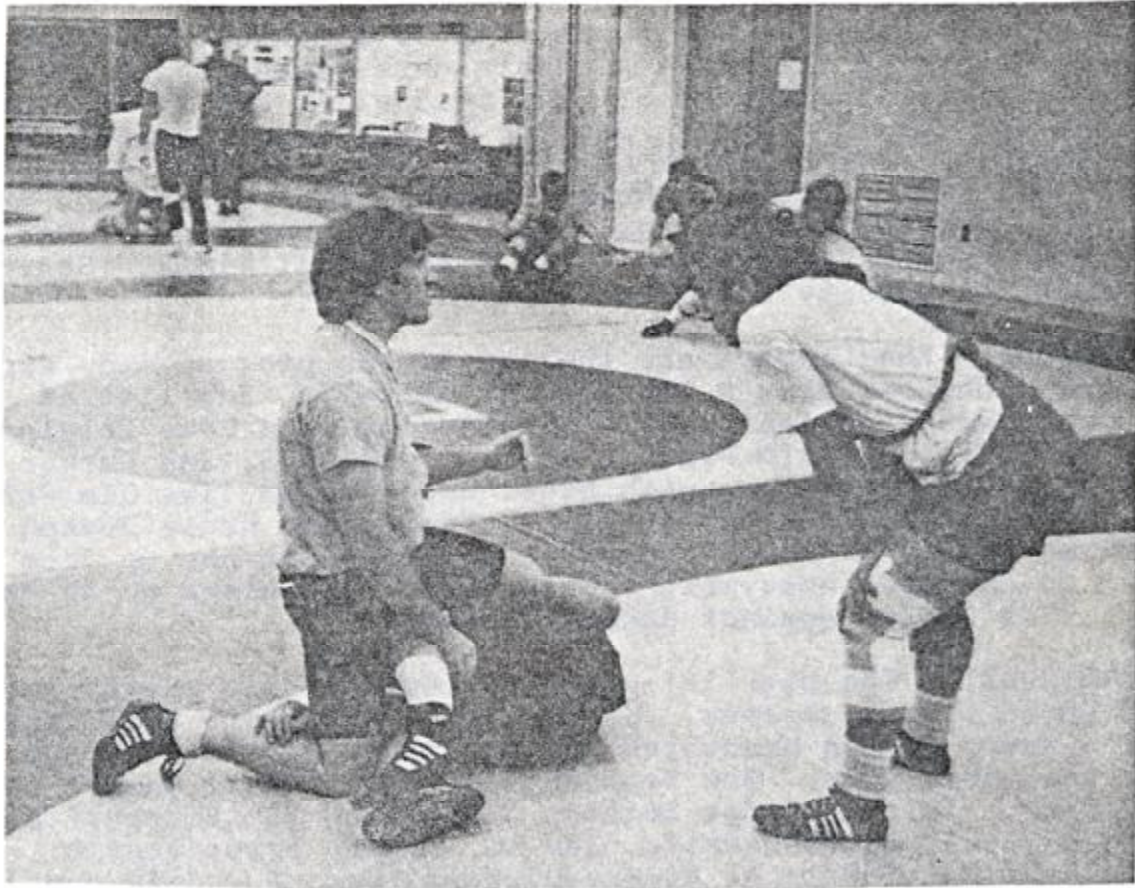

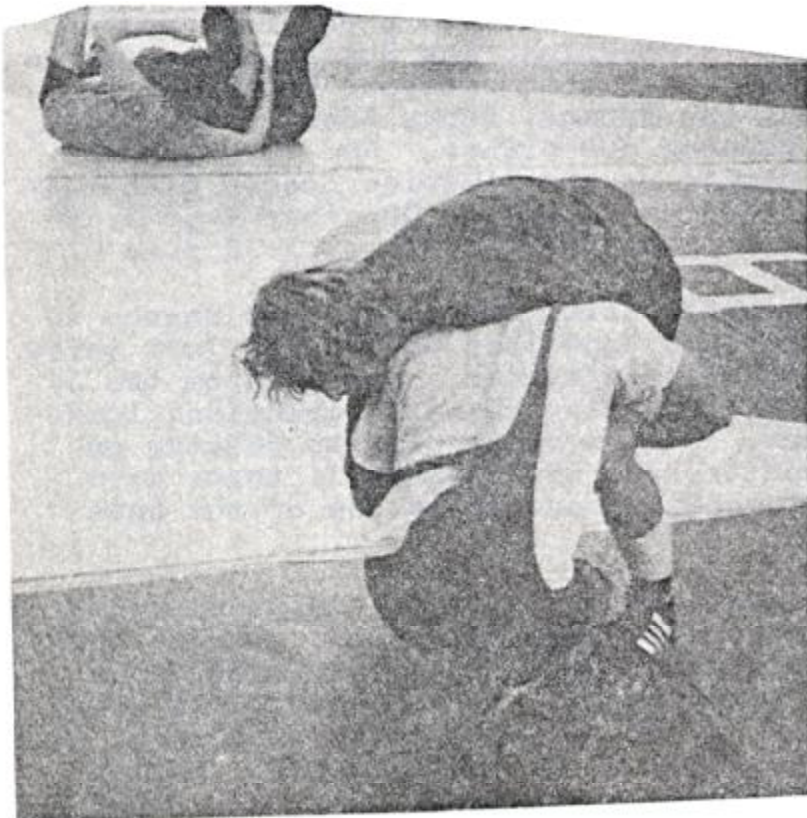
Olympic Gold Medal winner DAN GABLE, answering a question at his October 27 news conference at the home of Monroe Community College coach Roscoe Hastings.

Brockport's practices are informal & relaxed but a lot is accomplished because the Eagles really work hard. Their dedication should be apparent on December 7 when they have their home opener against the University of Buffalo. Match time is 7:00 p.m.

A PRE-SEASON LOOK AT SOME OF THE AREA
HIGH SCHOOL WRESTLING TEAMS

CANANDAIGUA ACADEMY - could prove to be #1 before the year is over. Returning from last winter's once-beaten squad are Gene Gigliotti, 3rd in Section 5; Mike Chappelle, 2nd in New York State; Ron Langdon, 2nd in Section 5; and Bruce Hadsell, 2nd in Section 5; along with a number of other varsity regulars from last year. Freshman Robert Hadsell is probably the most valuable new addition to the team. The Braves open on Dec. 2 at home against Victor, the Class B Sectional kings. Starting time of the varsity encounter is 8:00 p.m.

EASTRIDGE - The Lancers are the pre-season pick of many experts as the Rochester area's top team of 1972-73. The list of returning veterans from last year's varsity includes Dave Polsinelli, 2nd in Section 5; Jim Prince, 3rd in Section 5; and Parker Corts, 4th in Section 5; along with other dependables like Jim Polsinelli, Pete Locke, Rick Lembo, Rick Coffaro, and Eddie Joseph. Back from an injury is tough lightweight Roy Spring and up from the JV team is unbeaten heavyweight Brad Roth. EHS opens up at home on Dec. 2 at 8 p.m. against Greece-Athena.

IRONDEQUOIT - The big 'if' with the Indians this season involves the upper weight classes. Of the last 7 starters from last winter's team, 6 have graduated and the other didn't come out for the team this year. But from 98-126, all of last year's regulars are back. This includes Section 5 champion Tim Borshoff plus John Kawecki, Dan Benedetto, Jay St. James, Bruce Austin, and Pete Kundin. IHS is at Greece-Olympia (Dec. 9 - 2:30 p.m.) for its season opener.

SPENCERPORT - As always, the Rangers will be a power to contend with. Steve Silver, Section 5 champion, and Butch Teike, 4th in Section 5, are among the best returning veterans but Ron Brongo, Johnny Gringer, Tim Murray, Lou Brongo, Bucky Ades, Bill Christ, and Gary Baxter can't be counted out either. And some of last winter's JVs who will be coming up are likewise loaded with talent. Spencerport gets started at Medina on December 8 at 8:15 p.m. and hosts Batavia the following afternoon at 2:30 p.m.

HILTON - If the Cadets are optimistic, they have good reason to be. Jon Deacon, Clayton Barnard, and Greg Boylan are just three of a number of capable returning lettermen. And up from the JV team of a year ago are several really top-notch grapplers including another Barnard, Clark. Hilton plays host to Webster on December 6 at 4:15 p.m. and travels to Gates-Chili three days later (2:30 p.m.) for what should prove to be one of the best league meets of the season.

BISHOP KEARNEY - The team that was the class of the City-Catholic league last winter may be the very same this year. League champ Mike O'Connell returns along with fellow veterans Ernie Hanna, Jim Zambito, Jeff Fisher, Jerry Oberst, Vern Grassel, and George Meding. Last year's JV team at BK was also quite successful and some of their stars will no doubt be up on the varsity roster this time. The Kings are at East Rochester on Dec. 2 at 7:30 p.m.

GENESEO CENTRAL - besides Andy Lipson, who was Section 5 98 pound champ last winter, other key returning lettermen are Rick Scoville, Ray Magee, Butch Curry, and Dave Gibson. But ALL of last year's team is back since that squad had no seniors. The other veterans include Jim Stanley, Gary Cornell, Tom Wilson, Dave Aten, Jim Schneckenburger, John Alden, and Jim Cloud. The Livingston County league had better beware of Geneseo! The grapplers open at home on December 2 (6:30 p.m.) against Pavilion.

CARDINAL MOONEY - had some disappointments early in the practice season as veterans Jim and Tom DeSimon both quit after only one day and another letterman from last year, Charlie Erb, didn't even come out for the team at all. But in spite of all this, some good veterans are back - Doug Walker, Tom Batchelor, Carl Fredricks, Dave Kucy, and Brian Donnelly. The Cards reportedly open December 2 (2:30 p.m.) at home against Medina.

PITTSFORD - has lost some good matmen to graduation, but the Knights do have back last year's Monroe County 98 pound champ, Ken Frankel, and his fellow letter winners Bob Collins, Karl Frohm, and Bob Binkerd. The team has a rough opener on December 9 at Rush-Henrietta. It's a night meet.

EAST HIGH of ROCHESTER - has rugged Chester Shellman back at heavyweight. Other returning lettermen include Tim McFarland, Kelvin Fairwell, Craig Dade, Joe Spencer, Craig Reed, and Tom Boulis. All of these except Reed and Boulis were at East last year. Reed was at Madison last winter while Boulis competed for Franklin. Both wrestled at East two years ago before the reorganization. The Orientals open at home against Geneva on December 2 at 2:30 p.m.

EAST ROCHESTER - has five really dependable lettermen back in Chris Bourne, Armand Marianetti, Tim Duffy, Rich McPhee, and Bill Schick. The Bombers have been the Rochester area's most consistent winners over the years and it looks like the 1972-73 season will be another successful campaign for them. It gets underway on Dec. 2 at ER, 7:30 p.m. against Bishop Kearney.

CHURCHVILLE-CHILI - Gerry Lynch, Glen Roberts, Scott Court, Kevin Bumbarger, Craig Cody, and Bill Shetler are all back from last year's tough team. The Saints launch their reign of terror at home on December 1 at 8 p.m. against Medina.

EDISON TECH - city champ Tom Lachiusa returns for the Inventors along with fellow lettermen Larry Dunham, Harold Moore, Leo Rhodes, Doug Peacock, George Hodges, Walter Skellon, and Ray Valley. The team opens up on December 5 against Marshall at Marshall. Match time is 3:45 p.m.

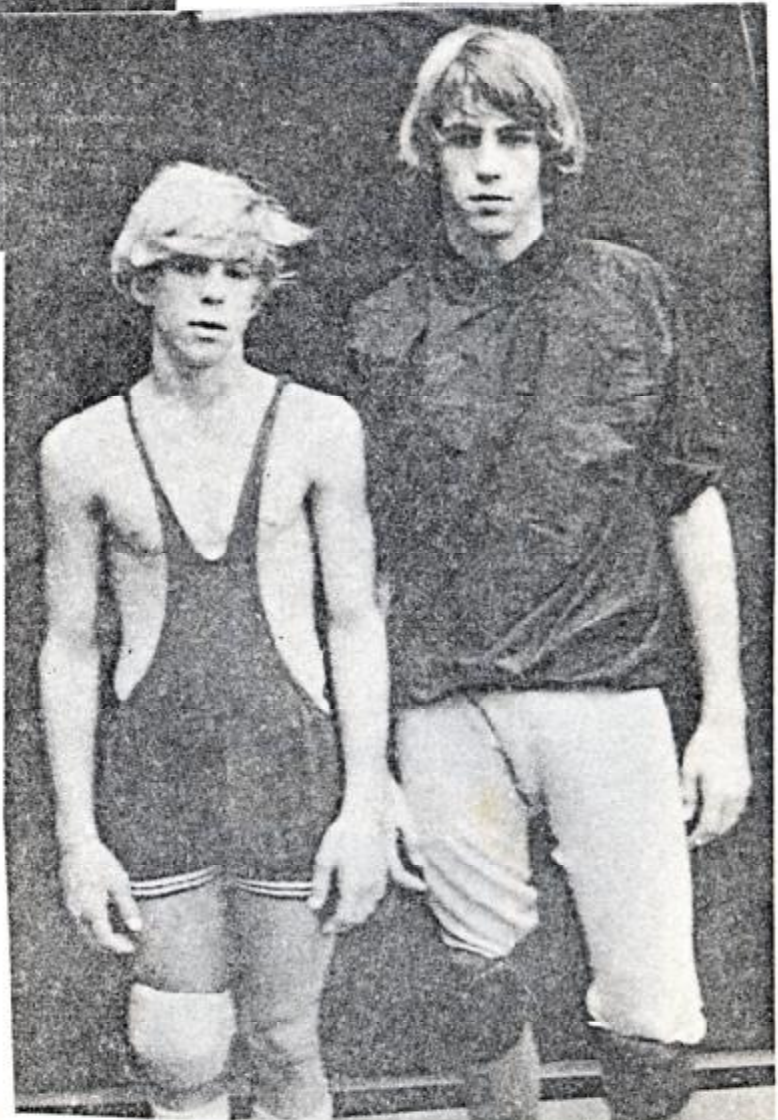

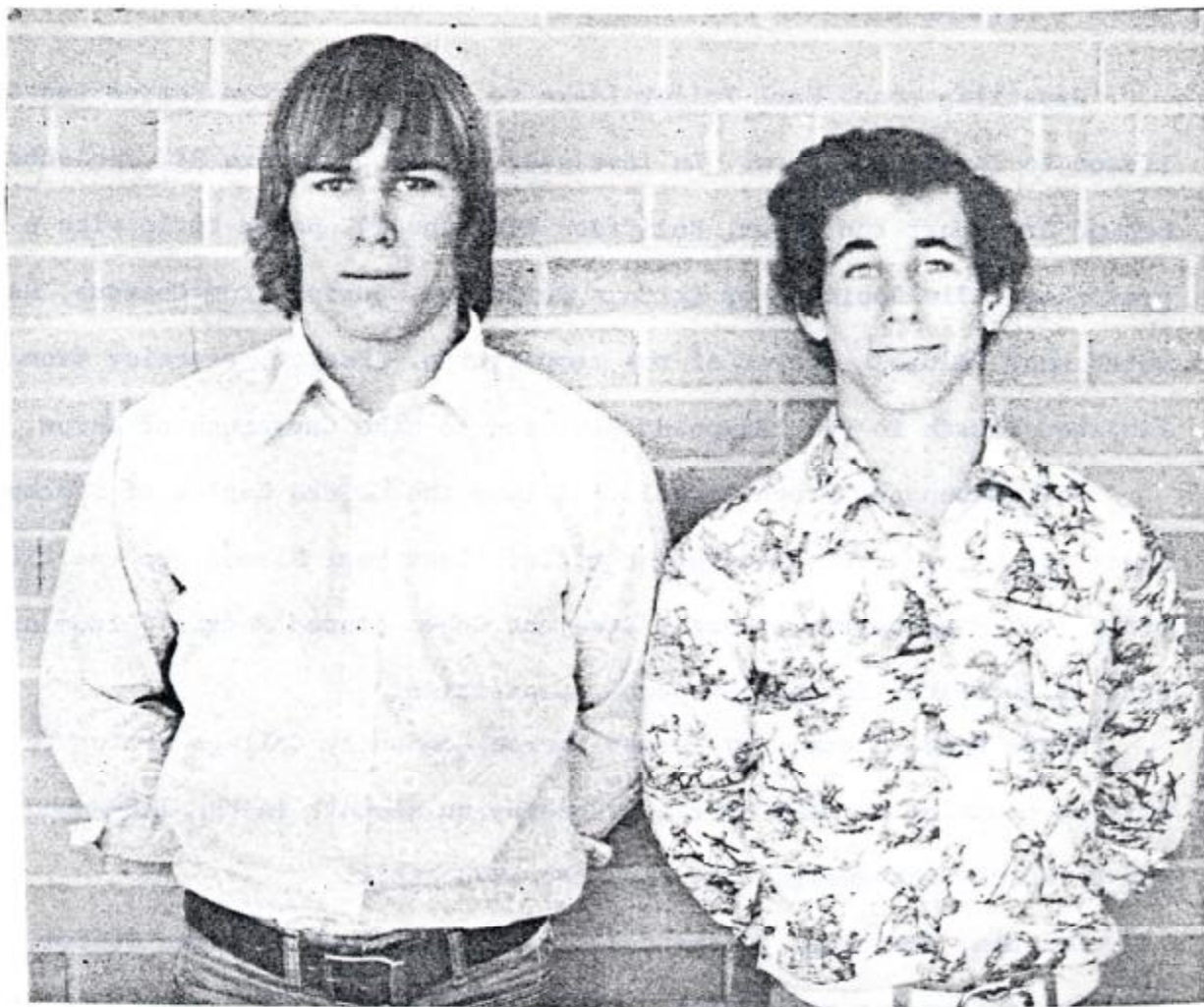

R.I.T. WRESTLING TOURNAMENT - DEC. 1 & 2, 1972

Here's a portion of a news release we received in regard to this college mat tourney:

Wrestling coach Earl Fuller looks to co-captains Tom Pearce and Ray Ruliffson to lead the Tigers. In last year's tourney, where RIT finished third behind Brockport and Akron, Ruliffson took the 142-pound title with a 13-6 decision over Jim Robinson of Akron. Ruliffson, junior from Conesus, was also voted Most Valuable Player of the competition. Pearce, a senior from Geneva finished fourth in the 134-pound division to Mike Cavanaugh of Akron.

Jeff Cohen and Bruce Biondi will lead the Golden Eagles of Brockport in their quest for a second straight title. Last year Biondi won the 118-pound title over Mike Martin of Notre Dame and Cohen pinned Reggie Wilcox of University of Rochester in the 134-pound competition.

Notre Dame, coached by former Monroe Community College mentor Terry Mather, will be counting on Mike Martin (runnerup to Biondi) in the 118-pound division and Al Rocek, heavyweight who took the 1970 title.

Colgate, newcomers to the tournament, will look to Steve Queior, Jim Rich and Dan Schramm for top honors. Queior was last season's most outstanding wrestler at Colgate in the 142-pound class. Rich, in the 167-pound division, finished last season 9-4-1. Schramm, at 177, has always been tough in competition.

Leading Akron will be junior Mike Turnbill, who decisioned Terry Phelan of Brockport in the 158-class.

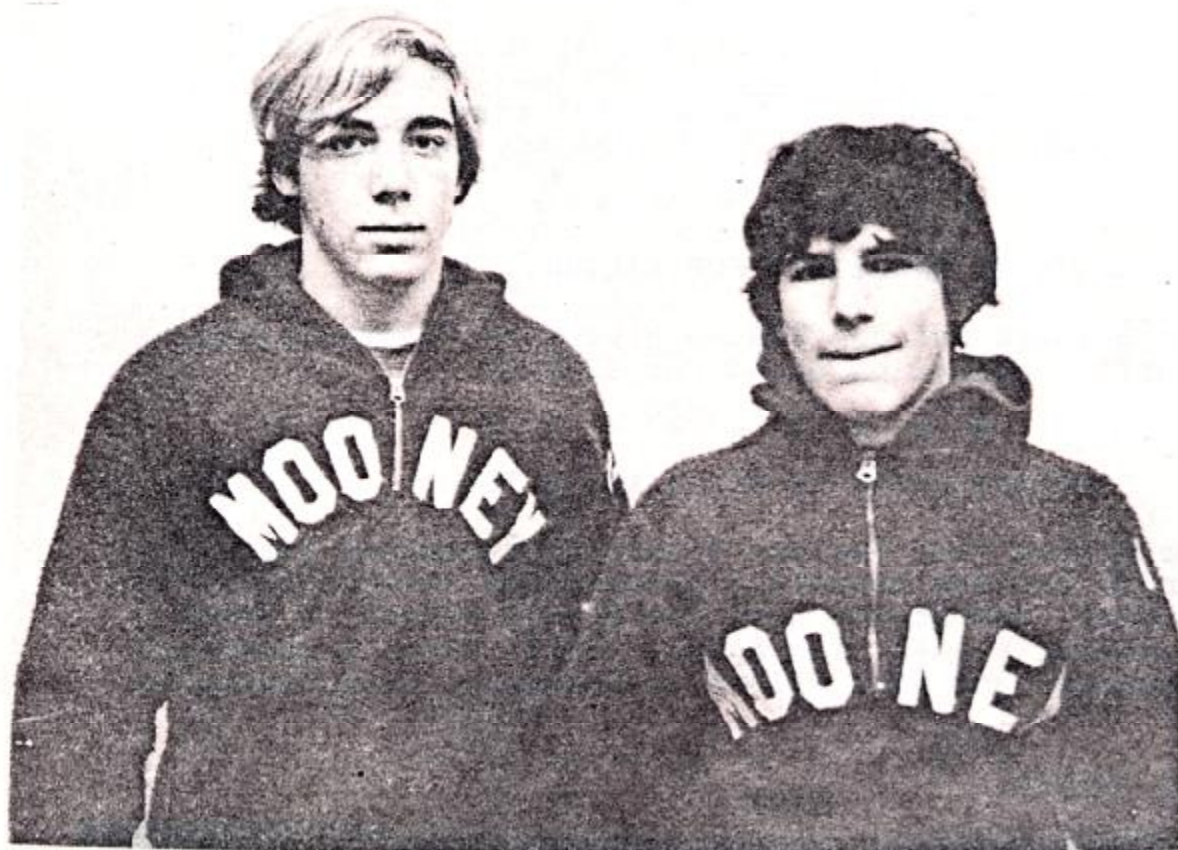
