A point was awarded to each team for an individual victory by decision, default for forfeit. A pin was worth 2 points and a superior decision (by-10-or-more-points)-was worth 11/2 points.

In tonight's action, an individual first place will be worth 10 points in team scoring, second place worth 7, third place 4, and fourth place

Both were quarterfinal victories. In the preliminary rounds, the Knights' Ron Zeno pinned Ron Allen of Edison at 5:09 of the 170pound match.

Steve Wu (129 pounds), Steve Miller (108 pounds) and Chuck Lawless (115 pounds) registerd the superior decisions for the Knights.

Madison had 3 pins, by James Jacobs, (132 pounds), Wal Clyburn (158 pounds) and Eric Davis (250 pound)
