Aubel's Raiders, Neal currently 9-0 and atop the Frontier League charts, replaced Watertown High School in the top 20 after Bob Ridall's crew lost its first of the season to Cicero two week's ago.

Union Endicott, 9-0 and winners of 55 straight, is the top mat school in the state while Section power Baldwinsville currently fourth.

In the State Small School Basketball poll, nine north teams received votes headed by unbeaten powers, Beaver River, Belleville, Harrisville, St. Josephs. Also included were Canton, Heuvelton, Indian River, Lyme, South Jefferson and St. Lawrence Central.

And speaking of Belleville, it should be noted that the Black Knights have upped their record to 230-25 over the past 13 years.
