Fulton Has Tough Foe in E. Rochester

"I've seen Huntington, Fulton and East Rochester this year, and I'd say East Rochester is the best of those three teams." — Sportswriter Gary Fallesen, Rochester Democrat & Chronicle.

Boasting 52 straight wins, two-time state wrestling team champion Fulton faces a formidable task Saturday as the Red Raiders travel west to take on East Rochester High School. More than a few observers are picking the No. 4 state-ranked Bombers to upend Fulton, which shares No. 1 status with Huntington of Long Island.

A sellout crowd is expected for the biggest dual meet showdown in Rochester history. East Rochester defeat underdog Canandaigua 34-20 Wednesday night for veteran coach Don Quinn's 299th win. This sets up "Super Saturday" against Fulton with Quinn gunning for his 300th, and biggest, dual triumph ever. Moreover, East Rochester's last loss was to Fulton last year 39-11.

Quinn, 51, is probably the most respected scholastic football (147-59-7 record) and wrestling coach (298-43-7) in Section Five. He has produced

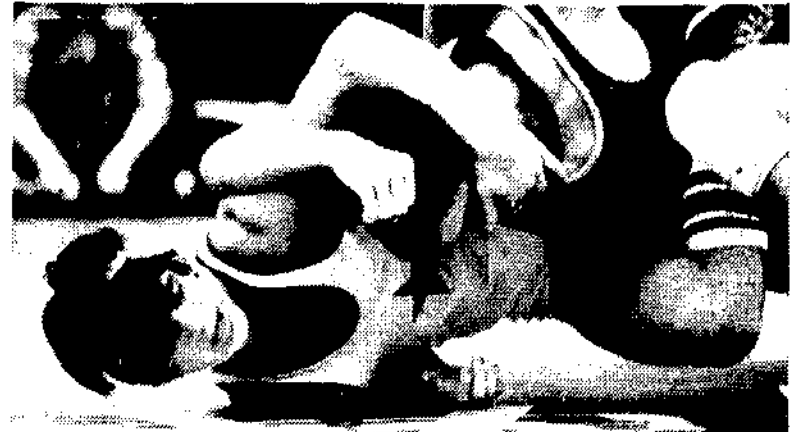

three state mat champions in Tim Gay (1970), Rich McPhee (1974) and Syracuse University's John Zito (1978). When Fulton visits, it will be "Super Saturday" at East Rochester's gymnasium this weekend.

Says Fulton Coach Wayne Bleau, "East Rochester has got a tremendous amount of incentive going for them — a possible No. 1 state ranking and Quinn's 300th win. This trip is not going to be easy."

Glancing at the lineups, Bleau feels the key early matchups will at 105 and 112 pounds (see lineups). "Neither team is outstanding at those weights, although the kids aren't bad, either," he says.

Fulton is likely to fall behind in the early going, then will rely on the overpowering strength of upper-weight performers such as Dave Angeleri

(13-1) at 138, Chuck Atkinson (13-0) at 145, Mike Maxam (14-1) at 167, Jeff Merritt (16-0) at 177 and Randy Cotton (16-0) at 215 to salvage victory.

East Rochester's finest are Sean Rucker (14-4) at 98, the coach's son. Tim Quinn (15-2) at 132, Tony Marcochia (11-2) at 145, Kevin Condon (16-4) at 167 and 1983 state runner-up

Chris Schojan (16-0) at 177.

Another intersectional showdown Saturday will send the top Southern Tier team — Union-Endicott — to Baldwinsville. The host Bees will be favored, but U-E will provide Coach Leo Johnson's Bees with a solid tuneup for the Jan. 28 confrontation with Fulton at the War Memorial.
