NRW's John Brooks Tops in Section 5 at 138

In the finals of the Spencerport Bernabi Tournament, John Brooks, North Rose-Wolcott senior, stepped onto the mat against state placewinner Chris Terry of Whitehall (Section 2). At that point, Terry was ranked number one in the state. After the match, his ranking slipped somewhat, as Brooks ripped him up, 13-5.

Brooks is currently 33-0-1 and the favorite to wrestle for Section Five at the states. He has wins over most of the top-ranked guys in the section. He is the Class B Sectional champ (for the second time), and has numerous tournament titles - Bernabi, Geneseo, Greece Athena, and Finger Lakes.

If North Rose-Wolcott was built a few apple orchards to the east, it would have been a Section 3 (Syracuse area) school. Right about now, fifteen 138 pounders are probably thinking that's not a bad idea. These are the athletes who will be looking to knock off kingpin Brooks at the state

Rob Kessler: Little Big Man

Webster's talented heavyweight wrestles like a lightweight

If you watched Webster senior heavyweight Rob Kessler from a distance, you'd think you were watching a 145 pounder. You would see quick duck-under, high crotches, singles, doubles, fireman carries, and several other moves usually reserved for non-heavyweight wrestlers.

Rob weighs 205 lbs, without any fat. Because of his iron physique and experience (he's wrestled most of the top big guys - Ethan Bosch, Jeff Wittman, Todd Levine, and others), he is able to wrestle as if he were much lighter. It's surprising to see a big man move so fast.

Kessler is undefeated this season at 29-0. He won the Webster Classic, Canandaigua Bradshaw, Monroe County, and Sectional Class A tournaments. In the latter, he breezed by with a technical fall, a 7-1 win,

Profile: Syracuse University

The Best Wrestling School in New York

Syracuse Wrestling: They're second to no one in New York State. They are a powerhouse in the East with five former NCAA qualifiers and eight placewinners at the Easterns last year.

Along with being athletically excellent, Syracuse University is one of the best academic institutions in the country. Today, some 16,000 undergraduate and graduate students attend SU. They represent all 50 states and 101 foreign countries. Together, SU's 12 undergraduate schools and colleges offer more than 200 different programs of study from Liberal Arts to specialized professional subjects.

SU's head coach, Ed Carlin, recently entered his 25th year coaching with a career mark of 217-145-5. He joined an elite group of Syracuse University coaches with

Committee leaders include Jim Kruze, Dick Freed, Ron Peer, Jim Allen, and Jack Yengo (Eastridge coach).

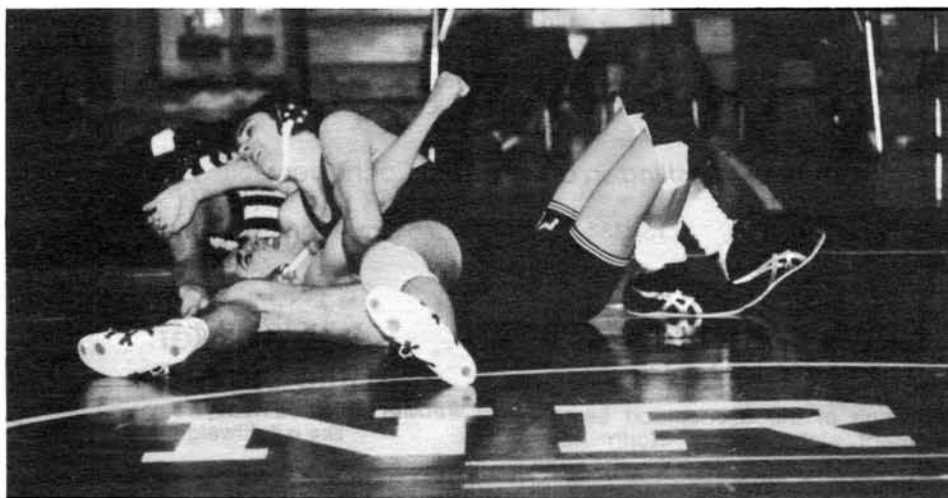

A few facts from HLS-DFA:

Alcohol: Nearly 5 million adolescents, or 3 out of every 10, have problems with alcohol. One out of every 15 will eventually become alcoholic.

Half of all public arrests are for alcohol-related offenses. Alcohol use is a factor in nearly half of all accidental deaths, suicides, and homicides in the US.

Marijuana: Young people using marijuana often lose interest in other areas of their life, like sports, friends, and school work. Marijuana interferes with learning by impairing thinking, reading comprehension, and verbal and mathematical skills.

qualifiers.

John's only non-win is a 6-6 tie with Bloomfield's takedown wizard, Terry Lucero. Lucero has been beating just about everyone at 167 this year. Now he is at 155 and is the clear favorite to win the state qualifier. Brooks and Lucero tangled at 155 (John was up a few weights to gain some experience). With only moments left, Brooks scored on a single leg TD to tie the match. An inconsequential match, but one that illustrates Brooks' talent.

John started in third grade when he heard an announcement on the school PA system about the team. Some future-thinking coach was on the ball! As a freshman, John was 17-12. His winning ways started the following year, as he went 30-6, then 33-4 as a junior.

For the past two years, he has made it to the semifinals of the state qualifiers. Last year he lost to eventual state runner-up Chris LoPresti of Spencerport, 10-5. The match was tied with 26 seconds remaining. Then, somehow, LoPresti scored a reversal and back points to advance to the finals. Says Brooks "Things happened so fast, it's really all a blur to me now. I remember the crowd giving us a standing ovation afterwards."

Brooks at least posted a win against that talented family during the off-season when he romped 17-4 over Joe LoPresti, Chris' younger brother. That was in freestyle, which Brooks specializes in. Over the summer, he took a silver medal in the Empire State Games, losing only to Johnson City's JJ Stanbro. Stanbro, by the way, is a 155 pounder on his way to earning more wins than any other NYS wrestler in history.

John is looking at several colleges, including Ithaca, Cortland, and Syracuse. He is a math and Spanish major, and finds physics "pretty interesting". He certainly understands the physics of wrestling, as he employs a wide variety of moves, including freestyle and Greco Roman styles. He wants to be a Phys Ed or Sports Medicine major.

Brooks won his second Class B title this past weekend with a 16-5 win over Brian Barnes of Attica. At the state qualifiers, he will be challenged by Pat White, Hilton's Class A champ, Todd Miller, Class C

champ from Marion, Ken Porter, Class D champ from Alfred-Almond, and several other veterans. However, none of them have done as well as John has in post-season and off-season competition.

Most fans expect Brooks to represent Section Five at the states. Fans from North Rose-Wolcott, friends, and family expect the same. This really hasn't caused John to feel a lot of pressure. His concentration is so intense and focused that nothing except winning gains his attention. Catch him in action during the post-season, and you'll see for yourself.

Note: Last year, John's Section B title was the first for NR-W in 15 years. Since then, he's won it again, and so have teammates Gary DeCarr, 112, Rich Steves, 119, and Larry Zerniak, 167. Much of the recent success of this team can be attributed to third year coach Rich Romeo. Originally from Huntington, Long Island, Romeo competed for SUNY Brockport before coming to NR-W in 1985.

RWN had seventeen letters and calls, mostly from parents, saying they felt it was something that needed to be said. We also had four responses from people saying it sounded too much like an attack on one program.

and a 9-2 win.

Last year he made it to the semifinals of the state qualifiers. Against Tim Spina of Waterloo, he was leading 6-5 with 20 seconds left. At that point, the official felt he was stalling and awarded Spina two points for stalling. Spina went on to the states, with four of his seven points coming from stalling calls.

Kessler's style is far from stalling - he constantly attacks with speedy takedowns and TD counters perfected from numerous freestyle tournaments. He wears down the opposition - if they last that long. Over half of his matches have ended with pins or technical falls.

Rob is a Business major. He is considering Edinboro University, Syracuse, and Clarion. In college, he'll compete at 190 pounds. "I still have some fat on me," Rob jokes.

His main competition at the upcoming state qualifiers should come from Jerry Pelusio, Fairport, Otha Davidson, Brighton, and Troy Stark, Canandaigua. He has beaten each one soundly this year. Others that may pose a threat include Jesse Phelps, Livonia, Aaron Mohr, Bloomfield, and Cory Fye, Alfred-Almond. Rob has yet to wrestle them.

If you get a chance to see Rob Kessler in action, don't miss out. He will certainly entertain. And if you sit way up in the bleachers, it will feel like you're watching a middle-weight - plenty of action, breath-taking technique, and superb conditioning.

Frank Trigg Giant Killer

McQuaid junior Frank Trigg is every top-seed's nightmare - a guy with the potential to pull off an upset. He's done it a few times so far this year, and will be in position to do so again at the state qualifiers.

Enter Tom Shifflet. He's the 138 pounder from Section Six (Sweet Home) ranked number one in Buffalo and number three in New York State. Up until the Hilton Clayton Barnard Tournament, he'd won everything, including a 19-4 manhandling of Spencerport's Tom Foos at the Jamestown Tournament. In the quarterfinals at Hilton, though, he faced Trigg.

To set the stage, dig this: Trigg wrestled for Monroe High last year. He did fairly well, but was not exactly a household name. And before Monroe, he was at Kendall, a class D school. And while Kendall has had some outstanding athletes, it's not exactly a hotbed of wrestling. "Not many kids from D schools do real well in state qualifier matches. They are so small, and far removed from where the toughest competition is," says Trigg. In other words, he has come from relatively humble beginnings. And no one, except Trigg, expected him to win against Mr. Number-Three-in-the-State. Especially when he already had a loss to Shifflet over the summer.

However, Trigg has done a lot of wrestling for a lot of different coaches. He learned basics from Jim Sauberan (Kendall); he learned heart from Mike Savidis (Monroe); and he learned technique from Lou Teike (McQuaid). And he learned a lot more from a host of opponents wrestled during the off-season. All these factors combine to make Trigg prone to big wins.

Anyway, back to Shifflet. Trigg beat him, by the way, 10-2. In the finals, though, Frank suffered a let-down, and lost to Spencer-

port star Tom Foos, 3-1. But the statement had been made. Says Frank, "I'm really a no-name. No one knew of me before I beat Shifflet. There's more pressure on me now, because everyone knows I have the ability to beat tough kids. I am working especially hard now."

In the Class A Sectionals, Trigg, competing at 145, pulled off a 1-0 upset win over Webster's Pat Yengo. And Yengo came into the match with some impressive credentials - winner of the Webster Classic and Canandaigua Bradshaw tournaments, including a 7-4 over Steve Taylor, runner-up in the Class A finals to Scott Reddick of McQuaid. Frank lost 10-5 to Reddick, but reserved a place for himself at the state qualifiers by taking third place. Yengo, surprisingly, did not place, yet overall had an excellent season. As for Reddick, does Trigg think he can pull off another upset? "Reddick is a strange wrestler. He's good, but he can be beaten", he says.

And so, the stage is set for perhaps future upsets - maybe at the qualifiers, or during the off-season, or perhaps next year. Of course, by then, his role will change - he will be the giant warding off would-be upsets.

his 200th career win on January 27, 1988. Thirty Orangemen have won EIWA championships under Carlin. Syracuse claimed the EIWA team championship twice - in 1965 and in 1981 - while placing second four times and taking third five times.

The Orange recently placed seven wrestlers in the prestigious Sunshine Open and placed 2nd out of 44 teams. After that, beating 14th ranked North Carolina State, they won the NY State Collegiate Championships. With seven finalists, they had three champs - Jim Fussell, Nick Garone, and Darin "The Terminator" Farrell.

At 118 pounds, SU's only senior Jim Fussell is 35-1 and ranked 4th nationally. Jim won the Mat-Town USA Tournament and the NYS title. The three-time Virginia state champ is on a roll. He owns victories over nationally ranked opponents, and is considered the best wrestler in New York.

Soph sensation Nick Garone, 142 pounds, is having a great year as he whaled through the NYS tournament and has compiled a 24-5-1 record so far. Among his losses were close decisions to NCAA Champ Pat Santoro, Pitt, and NCAA runner-up Shawn O'Day, Edinboro.

At 177, Darin "The Terminator" Farrell has been adjusting great after a bad shoulder injury. He started the year at 4-6 and now is 15-6 and looking better and better. He won the NYS title with two default victories a 9-0 win and a pin.

Co-captain junior Frank Ryan (158) has been injured since the Sunshine Open and has just returned to the mats with a 17-6 record. Back up (150/158) John Gautreau is a tough customer with a 21-9-3 record and was runner-up in the NYS tourney at 158. He was the Cornell Open champ.

Co-captain Chris Welch (167) and Judo Olympian Jason Morris (167) have been sharing duties. Welch is a three-time Cornell Open champ; he took second in the NYS tournament last year. He is 7-10 on the year. Morris is a 1986 EIWA champ and has a current record of 10-3. He was a two-time NYS high school state champ.

AT 190, Mark "Tonto" Kerr is 13-5 with two early losses at heavyweight. Kerr placed second in the state tournament. In the finals against highly ranked Steve Hasenfus of Columbia, Tonto apparently relaxed during the last ten seconds. Hasenfus scored five points and won 8-7. Kerr was second in the EIWA's as a freshman at 190 last year.

Sophomore Tom Ryan (150) is 25-6, winning the Great Dane Open, Trenton State Open, and taking second at the NYS tournament. He lost a 2-1 decision to Hofstra's Joe Sabol.

Freshman Rich Santana, a former NYS high school state champ, is 21-9-1 at 126. He placed third at the states, winning five matches along the way (including a 3-2 decision over Brockport's Fritz Zagorski). He also won the Great Dane Open.

The Orangemen are 16-4 and finally healthy and looking for the EIWA title and a top 10 finish in the Division I Championships. They are ranked 19th nationally.

The team also has an outstanding reserve group, many of whom are currently red-shirted. Some of these include Ralph Howard, a 1988 NYS placer and three-time Empire State Games champion; Chris Saba, a state placewinner and Greco National third place finisher from Delmar; Ethan Bosch, a 1988 NYS champ; and of course, Hilton's Rick Sadwick, a two-time state champ.

Referee's Corner

Here is the latest interpretation from Lon Coven, the New York State Rules Interpreter for High School Wrestling.

Q: Some teams are reinforcing the set-up for the cross face cradle by locking hands around the opponent's head or on the opponent's shoulder to help drive the head to the shoulder. Is this an illegal headlock?

A: Reference is made to the NYS Wrestling Interpretations Handbook, page 16; Functional Headlock. Interpreter's note: Circular motion or motion around the head is illegal. Pressure against the head may not be illegal. In the example above, if the top man applies twisting (circular) pressure, the hold can be called illegal.

Each section in NY also submits application for twelve available referee spots at this tournament. 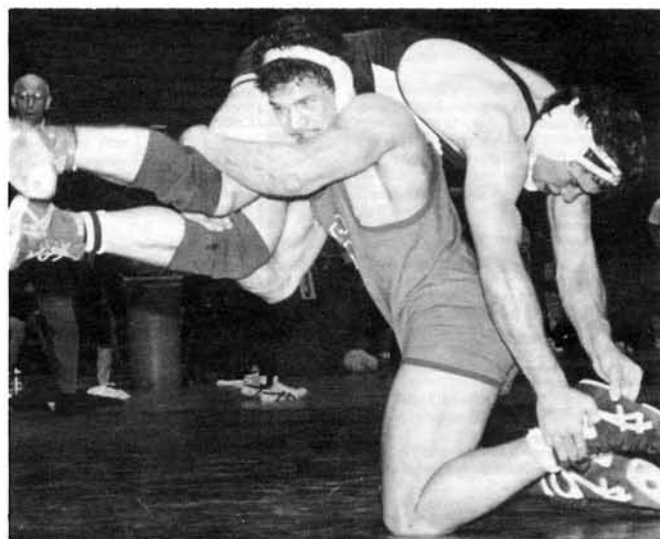
