
ESG Facts

The Empire State Games started in 1978 as a way to provide New York's best athletes with opportunities to compete, develop, and be seen in Olympic style competition.

Competitors number 7200 in summer finals, 1250 in winter. More than 70,000 participants compete in regional summer and winter qualifiers. Twenty seven summer sports and ten winter sports make up the Games, with men and women competing in scholastic, open, and masters divisions.

The age of nearly 3000 scholastic athletes range between 15 and 17: more than 3000 open division athletes are usually college age to early 30's; our 1200 to 1500 masters competitors vary in age from 30 to 80!. The total figure is nearly equally divided between men and women.

ESG Rankings



off four straight wins (10-4, 3-0 OT, 7-3, and 1-1 criteria decision) to make it to the finals. His semifinal victory was over a foe who had beaten him earlier in the year.

In the finals, he faced Wartburg's Dean Gavin, seeded second to Fusilii's first going into the competition. Fusilii owned a one-point win over Gavin from last year's tournament. This year, however, Gavin pulled out a tight 3-2 win. Says Fusilii, "We both hesitated a lot, and there wasn't much scoring. Our team had the title locked up before my match. Maybe I would have done better if we didn't. I'm not making excuses, though. It was disappointing, yet I was enthused about our team title."

For their efforts, each Ithaca wrestler received a gold NCAA Championship ring. Next March, the tournament will coincidentally be held at Ithaca. And with the whole team back (as well as redshirt national champ Mike Cronmiller), things look good for them to repeat.

Since the season, Mike has been active in wrestling. He won titles in Watkins Glen, Baldwinsville, and Brighton. And last month

he qualified for the Empire State Games finals by winning the Greco Roman 220 pound title and placing second in freestyle. He'll give his freestyle qualifying position to third place finisher Bill Condon (Canandaigua and Itnaca) to concentrate on Greco.

Fusilli has tons of Empire State Games experience. He won the Greco title in 1985 and took second in freestyle. In 1987, he added a bronze in Greco, and last year he placed fourth and fifth in Greco and freestyle. He's in strong position to win this year.

In the spring, Mike was part of the NCAA Division III All Star Team's Russian tour. The team was made of top Division III athletes, and made stops in Montreal, Amsterdam, and Warsaw before arriving in Leningrad. In Russia, they worked out with Soviet athletes and competed in several dual meets.

Fusilli won his first match by fall, then lost by fall in his next. In his third match, he faced the 1988 European champ, losing only 7-6. To finish on a winning note, he won the last bout 13-4. He was voted Best American Wrestler by his Soviet counterparts, and received a valuable vase as his prize.

Mike, who just turned 21, is majoring in Physical Education at Ithaca. He will graduate in 1990, and hopes to teach and coach in the Rochester area. He will also continue competing, which is definitely not good news for local 220 pounders.

Motivation for wrestling came from Mike's father, Leo. Now a teacher at Edison Tech,

Leo was a three-time City champ for East High back in the early 1960's. In 1964, he was a Sectional champ.

Mike started in ninth grade at Bishop Kearney. He tried other sports, but really became serious about wrestling when he was cut from the JV baseball team. Shortly afterwards, Coach Mike Cronmiller introduced Mike to freestyle and Greco.

When Coach Brian Chadwick left two years later for a position at Monroe, Leo stepped in as coach. Says Mike, "It was great having him as my coach. He's had a lot of experience. I don't think he would have taken the job if it wasn't for me, though."

Fusilli was 35-3 his senior year. He won the State Qualifier and competed in the states. Although he did not place, he did place in the NYS Collegiate States the following year - his first at Ithaca. "That was a millestone for me, and it was largely due to our tremendous coaching staff, John Murray and Dave Auble," says Mike.

Murray says this of Fusilli, "Mike is a super individual who has been a key contributor to our national success the past few seasons. He should be a top contender for an NCAA title next year."

In 1987, Fusilli took a sixth place in the NCAA's. This year he jumped to second. He finished the season at 30-8 (79-30-1career). He placed in several tournaments - 1st in NCAA East Regionals; 2nd in the Cornell and Ithaca Opens; 3rd at RIT; and 5th in the NY States.

Next season will be his last. After the national tournament in March, it's a good bet that Mike Fusilli will either be lugging home a first place medal or wearing another team championship ring.


Three Cronmiller Brothers Qualify

Brothers Mike, Bill, & Steve make ESG Team
There have been a few brother wrestling
trios in this area, and one of the top sibling
threesome of the 1980's would be the
Cronmiller brothers - Mike, Bill, and Steve.
All three recently qualified for the Empire
State Games finals by placing in the Western Region Trials. The trials were held in
Olean on June 17 and 18. The finals are
slated for the first week in August in Ithaca.

Mike and Bill are Edison Tech graduates, while Steve has one more year with the Inventors. Returning to action after a year of redshirting, Mike, a 1988 Division III NCAA champ, won six straight matches in the Greco Roman 163 pound class. It was his first competition in a year. Mike has one year of mat eligibility left at Ithaca where he is pursuing a Physics Engineering degree with teaching certification.

Bill was runner-up at 220 pounds in Greco Roman. He won three matches and lost only to Mike Fusilli of Bishop Kearney and Ithaca. Bill, a former MCC student, plans to attend Cortland State this fall and major in Mathematics.

The youngest brother, Steve, competed in the scholastic division at the qualifier. He won the freestyle division at 192 pounds, and was runner-up in Greco at 215 pounds. Steve is a three-sport athlete at Edison - football, wrestling, and tennis. He studies aeronautics and is working on getting his small aircraft pilot's license.

Great Lakes Wrestling School Successful

The Great Lakes Wrestling School, directed by Bill Jacoutot and held at Roberts Wesleyan College, attracted over 150 wrestlers this year. It ran from July 9 - 14. In its second year, the camp featured some top clinicians, including lke Anderson, Olypican and National Greco Champ, Gus D'eAugustino, former NCAA Champ and Olympian, Fred Powell, NCAA Champ, Woody Vandenburg, Div III NCAA Champ, Graig Cody, NJCAA All American, and Jack Cuvo, two-time NCAA Champ.

Cuvo, of East Stroudsburg State, won his titles at 118 pounds. As a senior, he went 45-0 and ranks third on the all-time win list for Division I wrestlers. Last year he was an alternate to Ken Chertow, Penn State, for the US Olympic team at 114.5 pounds. Since then, he's beaten Chertow twice. Since graduation, he has been active in freestyle competition, including two wins over top Russian wrestlers.

Cuvo alone was worth the price of the

camp. Without a doubt, he was the most popular clinician. His humorous style, non-stop banter, and perfect technique made for an amusing and educational time.

Several local wrestlers participated, including Steve Taylor, Jason Bovenzi, Anthony Conte, Mike Licatta, Joel and Justin Raines, Rob Giannavola, Kevin Summers, and Todd Baumgartner.
